


#### Early Literacy Panics and First Calls for Schools in the US

"It being one chief project of that old deluder Satan to keep men from the knowledge of the Scriptures...It is therefore ordered, that every township in this jurisdiction, after the Lord hath increased them to the number of fifty households, shall then forthwith appoint one within their town to teach all such children... It is further ordered that when any town shall increase to the number of 100 families, they shall set up a grammar school."

Massachusetts' Old Deluder Satan Law, 1647

5. All acts and parts of acts coming within the purview of this <u>Repealing</u> claume. not shall be and the same are hereby repealed: *Provided always*, That nothing in this act contained shall be construed to repeal any act heretofore made, for so much thereof as may relate to any offeace committed or done, or claim which may have accrued, before the commencement of this act.

6. This act shall be in force from and after the first day of May Commercement. next.

#### CHAP. XXXIX.—AN ACT to amend the act concerning slaves, free negroes and mulattoes. [Passed April 7, 1831.]

1. Be it enacted by the general assembly, That all free negroes Free negroes and and mulattoes, who shall be convicted of remaining in this common-induces remaininvestity of aw, and who shall become liable to be sold accer to be an enable cording to the provisions of former laws and of this act, shall be wide publicly sold by the sheriff or sergeant, at the front door of the court-boune of the county or corporation, on a court-day in pursu-Noise of and reance of notice of such sale, posted at such court-house door, at the <sup>quired</sup>.

2. Be it further enacted, That the several superior courts of law, Jurisdiction in as well as the county and corporation courts, shall have jurisdiction such processions of all prosecutions against free negroes and mulattoce, offending in as well acounty manner aforesaid, and may try and determine the same according courts. to law.


3. Be it further enacted, That it shall be the duty of all com-Commissioners of missioners of the public revenue, once in every year, to present to prove to prethe grand juries of the several courts aforesaid, a list of all free ne-&c. so remaining groes and mulattoes, who, in the opinion of such commissioners, in state. Bay have remained within the commonwealth, contrary to law, upwards of twelve months from the time of their emancipation.

4. Be it further enacted, That all meetings of free negroes or Meetings for multitoes, at any school-house, church, meeting-house or other gross, &c. reading place for teaching them reading or writing, either in the day or or writing, prohibited. Dight, under whatsoever pretext, shall be deemed and considered as an unlawful assembly; and any justice of the county or corporation, Justice to issue wherein such assemblage shall be, either from his own knowledge, warman to appremeeting, shall issue his warrant, directed to any sworn officer or officers, authorising him or them, to enter the house or houses where such unlawful assemblage or meeting may be, for the purpose of apprehending or dispersing such free negroes or mulattoes, and Punishment to inflict corporal punishment on the offender or offenders, at the discretion of any justice of the pacee, not exceeding twenty lashes.

5. Be it further enacted, That if any white person or persons penalty on white assemble with free negroes or mulattoes, at any school-house, persons for asenacting the person of the person of the person of the person of the such free negroes or mulattoes to read or write, such person or permeters to instruct such free negroes or mulattoes to read or write, such person or perand writing. Nons shall, on conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, and moreover may be imprisoped at the discretion of a jury, not exceeding two months.





## Virginia Literacy Act

"Like children across the nation, Virginia's children are in the midst of a literacy crisis. Across the Commonwealth, one in three kindergarten to second grade students are reading below benchmark, and far too many third graders are not passing their Reading SOL. This impacts students for years to come; students who are not proficient in reading by the end of third grade are four times more likely to drop out of high school than proficient readers."
